Enrollment in the program without passing the master's examinations is possible in accordance with the procedure established by the Ministry of Education and Science of Georgia. Submission of a certificate/document confirming proficiency in a foreign language (English, German, French, Russian) at level B2 is mandatory. Applicants who received their education abroad (who have completed a program taught in a foreign language) are not required to take the exam or submit a certificate. An applicant who is unable to submit the said certificate is required to undergo testing at the GTU Computer Center in one of the foreign languages (English, German, French, Russian). Admission to the second part of the master's program is open to persons holding a Master's academic degree in Construction Engineering and Management, who are enrolled in the program in accordance with the legislation of Georgia.

In order to verify the level of language proficiency, the applicant must submit an international TORFL (The Test of Russian as a Foreign Language) Level II certificate (corresponding to level B2 of the European ALTE testing system) as confirmation of proficiency in the language of instruction. Such an applicant is exempt from the language-of-instruction exam. In the absence of such a certificate or other relevant document, the applicant is required to undergo testing in order to demonstrate actual competence in the Russian language. Admission to Part II of the master's program is open to persons holding a Master's academic degree in Oil and Gas Production Technology, who are enrolled in the program in accordance with the legislation of Georgia.
